Proposition A

\$9,840,000 Bonds For Elementary School Facilities

Shall Ordinance 93-041 be approved; shall the project to construct the new North Fairbanks Elementary School be approved; and shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough incur debt and issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed Nine Million Eight Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$9,840,000), as authorized in Borough Ordinance No. 93-041 for the purpose of paying the cost of planning, designing, acquiring property for, and constructing the North Fairbanks Elementary School, together with all necessary appurtenances, equipment and facilities in connection therewith?

NEW NORTH FAIRBANKS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROJECT

No bonds authorized under this proposition may be issued until the state and the borough have executed grant agreement(s) that will provide funds wich, with bond proceeds and other funds that are allocated to the project, are sufficient to construct a new Fairbanks elementary school.

The amount shown as the estimated amounts to be paid by the state and the borough may be changed depending on the final allocation by the Assembly of the state grant among the eligible school projects.

If any proceeds of the bonds authorized under this proposition remain after construction of the elementary school, such excess may be expended on other school capital projects that have been approved by the voters, the Assembly and the Department of Education.

Proposition D

Shall Section 3.08.145 of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Code Of Ordinances be repealed and reenacted? This section now provides for limitations on the maximum allowable tax revenues for the Fairbanks North Star Borough; the Borough can levy only the same amount of taxes for one fiscal year as the Borough levied for the preceding year, except that the Borough can raise the amount of taxes levied (a) to adjust of inflation; (b) to take into account new buildings and land coming into the tax rolls; (c) make payments on bonds; (d) pay for services approved by voters; (e) pay for new legal judgments entered against the Borough; and (f) pay for expenses in emergencies. **PASSED**

* A "YES" means that the tax cap would be repealed; reenacted and unable to be amended for two years. - 9318

A "No" vote means that the tax cap would not be repealed and reenacted however would remain a borough law but be able to be amended. — 8144

Proposition E

Shall Section 8.12.033(f) be initiated which would state the following: It is the policy of the Fairbanks North Star Borough to encourage recycling, reuse, and reduction of solid wastes generated in the borough. These efforts shall include payment of actual avoided costs of hauling and land filling to approved recyclers/reusers.

Proposition F

Health and Social Services Powers

Shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough exercise areawide health and social services powers to maintain the Fairbanks Health Center building, and to receive and pass-through health and social services grants and assist in raising any required community match?

A "No" vote would mean that the borough would not assume limited areawide health and social services powers – 5785(non-city) 2999(city)
